It will describe how this novel position integrates with fellow IDT members, demonstrate a tracking system used to manage the program, and show the potential outcomes of a successful program.

These outcomes include improved Medicare A PDPM rates, improved Medicaid Case Mix rates, potential for improved Quality Outcome Measures, happier residents, and reduced SNF caregiver burden.
