

10 REASONS TO WORK IN ELDER CARE



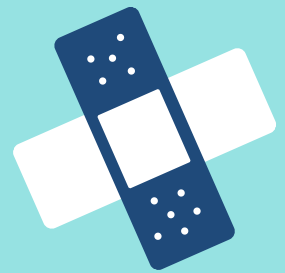
1 JOB SECURITY

Healthcare workers make good money. The average entry-level health worker earns from \$15 to \$50 per hour. The more experience and training you get in your field, the more money you can make.



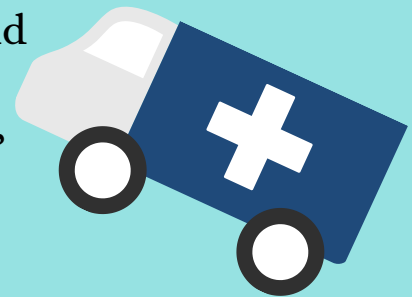
3 CLEAR PATH TO ADVANCEMENT

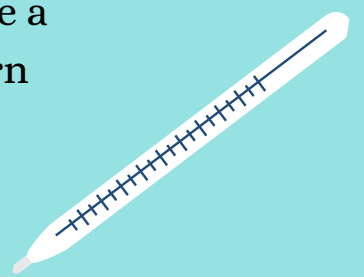
4 YOU CAN GET HELP TO PAY FOR SCHOOL
