Present Challanges and Future Opportunities in Assisted Living

Speaker: Gerald Hamilton, Chairman of the NCAL Board of Directors, Beehive Homes of Albuquerque

The Survey Process in Assisted Living

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Quality: When in Doubt, Check it Out!

We provide quality care and services to our residents, but words alone do not support quality. According to the World Health Organization, quality of care is the degree to which health services for individuals increase the likelihood of desired health outcomes. Assisted living communities are admitting higher acuity residents than ever before. As a result, there is a critical need to improve quality and be able to prove it through the power of data. Quality improvement is foundational framework used to systematically improve care. Improvement in quality seeks to reduce variations and standardize processes to achieve predictable results and improve resident outcomes. This session will review the importance of quality and data in telling your story, and how to engage your teams in organization-wide quality improvement efforts by following the core concepts of the Baldridge framework. Put simply, quality makes no sense without "U" and "I" and it takes everyone playing their part to accomplish efficiency, improve outcomes, and reduce costs.

Regulations in AL Communities

The pandemic changed the survey dynamic in assisted living to be more like nursing home surveys. As we come out of the height of pandemic trends, the frequency and intensity of assisted living survey has increased. This session will explore current trends in survey activity, what surveyors are looking for and how to be prepared. Presented from the perspective of a current survey lead, this session will help providers become survey ready and survey confident.

Abuse Reporting

During this session, discuss good processes; identify abuse and get secure in knowing your teams can too. Review requirements for reporting, and develop a streamlined, consistent investigation processes that satisfy all parties. Learn how to smooth the waters for a safe community (resident, family, staff awareness communication and resolution following investigation), and know when a discharge is the last remaining option
